

STARTING STEPS FOR NURSING

First Time Freshmen:

- Apply to the University
- Declare Nursing as your major
- Submit an official High School Transcript from all schools attended
- Submit ACT/SAT scores to the University
- Submit immunization records to the University
 - Measles
 - Mumps
 - Rubella
 - Diphtheria
 - Tetanus
- Sign up for and attend freshman orientation

Transfer Students with less than 12 non-developmental credit hours:

- Apply to the University
- Declare Nursing as your major
- Submit official transcripts from all previous institutions to the Registrar
- Submit ACT/SAT scores to the University
- Submit immunization records to the University
 - Measles
 - Mumps
 - Rubella
 - Diphtheria
 - Tetanus
- Make an appointment to be advised
- Sign up for and attend transfer orientation

Transfer Students with more than 12 non-developmental credit hours:

- Apply to the University
- Declare Nursing as your major
- Submit official transcripts from all previous institutions to the Registrar
- Submit immunization records to the University
 - Measles
 - Mumps

- Make an appointment to be advised
- Sign up for and attend transfer orientation

NOTE: The College of Nursing is responsible for determining which transfer credits may be applied in the baccalaureate degree program.

Accelerated Option Students:

- Have a Bachelor's Degree
- Apply to the University
- Declare Nursing as your Major
- Submit official transcripts from all previous institutions to the Registrar
- Submit immunization records to the University
 - Measles
 - Mumps
 - Rubella
 - Diphtheria
 - Tetanus
- Make an appointment to be advised
- Apply for the transitional course by the deadline
- Select hospital preferences on application
- Meet with hospital after assignment for contract signing
- Receive stipend payments from hospital after contract signing

NOTE: Stipend checks may be distributed after the deadline for tuition
